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#### **Event Location**

#### Locality Maps

The event centre and Hash House is located in the Warrumbungle National Park, 36Km west of Coonabarabran. Maps of Coonabarabran and the Warrumbungle region are available on the Travel page of the event website - <u>http://www.rogaine2006.com.au/travel.htm</u>

#### **Travelling Routes**

From **Sydney**, the Great Western Highway via the towns of Mudgee, Dunedoo and Mendooran is the most direct route to Coonabarabran and is a good sealed road all the way.

From **Newcastle** take the New England Highway via Braxton to Merriwa and follow the signs to Coolah along the Golden Highway. Then travel via Binnaway to Coonabarabran.

If you are travelling from **Melbourne** or **Brisbane**, just follow the Newell Highway.

From Adelaide, choose from:

- travelling across the Hay Plains and then up the Newell Highway at West Wyalong; or
- via Broken Hill, exit at Nevertire and travel via Warren and Gilgandra to Coonabarabran

The regional centres of Tamworth and Dubbo are easy two hour drives either side of Coonabarabran.

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#### **NSWRA Coach Travellers**

Those travelling to the event on the NSWRA coach from Sydney should have received details by email on 16 September and already confirmed your plans with the event Administrator. Please contact <a href="mailto:admin@rogaine2006.com.au">admin@rogaine2006.com.au</a> if you have not already done so.

You will be able to register on the coach if you have a completed Indemnity Form signed by all team members along with any payments you need to make.

The coach is expected to arrive in Coonabarabran about 6:00pm and then proceed to the event site, arriving about 6:45pm.

The camping area set aside for coach travellers and other areas for camping are shown on the event site map on the next page.

For NSWRA coach travellers with accommodation in Coonabarabran there will be time constraints on the trips between the event site and Coonabarabran after the event finish. The coach will travel from the event site to Coonabarabran after 2:30pm on Saturday for only 1-2 hours before returning for the evening meal and celebrations. The coach will then depart for Coonabarabran again by 8:30pm.

#### When you Arrive

#### Parking & Camping

Camping at the event site is available from 12.00 noon on Thursday.

After entering the Warrumbungle National Park, travel directly to the event centre where you will be greeted by a team of volunteers to help you get orientated and in particular, parked and camped.

Parking will be outside the main congregation area so that the area is set aside for pedestrians. This will mean that you will need to camp a short walk from your vehicle. There is some camping space available which is further from the Hash House and shared with the general public that provides for camping beside your vehicle.

## Registration

Registration will be available at the event centre, near the Hash House from 12:00 noon till 9:30pm on Thursday and from 7:00am on Friday. Registration will also be available in Coonabarabran, at the Visitor Information Centre, from 2:00pm till 5:00pm on Thursday afternoon.

To register, you must bring a completed Indemnity Form signed by all team members along with any payments you need to make.

Team changes that do not involve adding extra team members are possible but if you can, please email <u>admin@rogaine2006.com.au</u> by 6 October.

## Meals, Clothing & Compass Orders

Pick up of meal tickets for Thursday night as well as clothing and compasses that have been ordered will be available near the Hash House and registration area from 12 noon on Thursday, as well as Friday morning and Saturday afternoon.

Please bring a copy of your order confirmation email.



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#### <u>Administration</u>

The administration processes before the start of the event will separated into three main steps.

<u>Registration</u> (see previous page) will record your arrival at the event; collect indemnity forms and payments; provide refunds arranged and address any other issues and last minute team changes required. At registration, you will receive two tickets required to collect your maps and Navlight tag on Friday morning.

A <u>Navlight Tag</u> for electronic scoring will be issued to <u>one</u> person in each team and attached with a security wrist band that cannot be removed without breaking.

Maps will be distributed in exchange for the ticket issued when registering.

#### Scoring

We will be using traditional punch cards at this event and these cards must be punched at every checkpoint.

We will also be using an electronic system known as Navlight. One Navlight tag will be issued to each team. You are strongly encouraged to use this system which also involves 'punching' the tag with an electronic punch at each checkpoint. As you finish, the electronic system will provide a printed report showing your final score plus details of each control visited and the time of each visit.

The Navlight system will be used in the first instance to verify your score. If you do not use the Navlight punch at every checkpoint then you must inform administration and your traditional card will be used to determine your score.

In the event of any disputes, official protests, or issues with your Navlight score, the traditional punch card will be used to determine your score. Scores will NOT be determined from a combination of visits recorded by Navlight and punch cards.

The preferred method of recording finish times is to use the Navlight system.

## Navlight Electronic Tag Distribution

Distribution of Navlight tags (one per team) will occur near the Hash House and registration area from 7:00am on Friday.

Tags will be provided in exchange for the 'Tag' ticket issued to your team when registering. Tags will be fitted with a security wrist band as they are issued so you need to have decided which team member will wear the tag for the duration of the event.

Tags will be activated with an electronic punch when fitted and there will also be 'test' punches available before the start so that you can try it out. The electronic punching is very quick and easy.



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## **Map Distribution**

Distribution of maps (one per team member), control descriptions and flight plans (route intentions) will occur near the Hash House and registration area from 9:00am on Friday.

Maps will be provided in exchange for the 'Map' ticket issued to your team when registering.

## **Flight Plans**

As a safety precaution, each team will be required to submit a plan showing their intended route. A copy of the course map will be provided to mark up with your team's intended route and collection points will be provided around the Hash House and administration area. Please ensure you return your plan before the start.

## **Control/Punch Cards**

Traditional punch cards will be used for scoring in parallel with the electronic, Navlight system. Refer to the section on the previous page to ensure you are aware of how. scores will be determined. The cards will have a waterproof coating and a hole punched in one corner and will NOT be issued prior to the start.

You will need to collect your card from the hanging line at the start of the event.

## The Event Map & Controls

The map size is  $65 \times 62$  cm including borders. You should bring a map bag or enough 'contact' to protect your map. The scale is 1:33,333 or 3cm = 1km, with 10m contour interval.

It is against the rules (Rule R7) to have in your possession at the Hash House a map which shows information additional to that shown on the competition map. The Warrumbungles National Park map (1:40,000) and LPI standard topographic maps (1:50,000) of the area show less information than the competition map and are therefore permitted under this rule.

## Rules

The Rules of Rogaining published by International Rogaining Federation are provided with these Final Instructions as a separate document.

Rogaining is an amateur sport to be enjoyed by social and competitive participants and event organisers. These rules are based on those originally developed by the Australian Rogaining Association and have been drafted with simplicity and enjoyment as primary guides. They govern the conduct of all rogaining events organised by any group affiliated with the International Rogaining Federation. The rules are composed of four parts as follows:

Part A: Introductory Comments <u>Part B: Rules for Participants</u> Part C: Technical Standards for Organizers Part D: Special Requirements for the World Rogaining Championships
