Sutherland Shire METROGAINE 28 April 1996

Course Setter's Notes

The Metro '96 course map is reprinted from the 1:25000 topographic map Port Hacking. The use of this type of map for a suburban rogaine has the advantage of allowing competitors to use natural features as well as roads to navigate. The distinct disadvantage is that **not all roads are marked**. To compensate for this in part, all known useful public access ways and footpaths have been marked in in black. It is absolutely essential that no private property is trespassed upon. There is no need to cross private property to complete the course. Be very careful between 37 and 60. If you cross the creek too far south, you will come out into an unfenced back garden. Also, don't cut across the park from 46 to Sylvania Road. It leads through private property.

The bush along creeks and on steep slopes near the waterfront should be regarded as impenetrable unless a track is marked. The exception is Coonong Creek Bushland to the NW of Gymea Bay but it has a good network of tracks and parks, most of which have been marked. They should be used for access to controls 56, 60 and 70.

Crossing the railway line is only possible at the points shown on the map and are listed below. West to East:

Sylvania Rd, Wandella Rd, Kiora Rd, Kareena Rd, Kingsway at Caringbah Station, Gannons Rd, Woolooware Station, Green St and Burraneer Bay Rd.

The golf courses are surrounded by high fences and are out of bounds.

Dont even think about swimming between 49 and 54 or between 50 and 53.

The track marked to the NE of 26 (top left hand corner) does connect with the Boulevarde (just off the edge of the map).

Metrogaines, by necessity cover some very busy roads. We cannot stress firmly enough the importance of proper road safety while on the course. Cross the busiest roads like President Ave, Taren Point Road and the Kingsway at pedestrian crossings. Extreme care must be taken at all times!!!

Metrogainers have no special right of way!!!

There will be a tea and damper stop located on the walking track at Lilli Pilli point between 63 and 64 (marked T on map). This will be open from 11:00 to 3:00 for those who wish to stop and have a cuppa and admire the view.

Basic Rules of Rogaining:

- 1. All team members must get to within 20 metres and within sight of each checkpoint visited.
- 2. Teams must not split up and must remain within earshot of each other.
- 3. No map(s) other than the one provided shall be used for route planning or while on the course.
- 4. Points are deducted from late finishers scores at the rate of 10 points per minute late. **Don't be late!!!**
- 5. Every team is to hand in their control card to the admin desk (regardless of how small the score).
