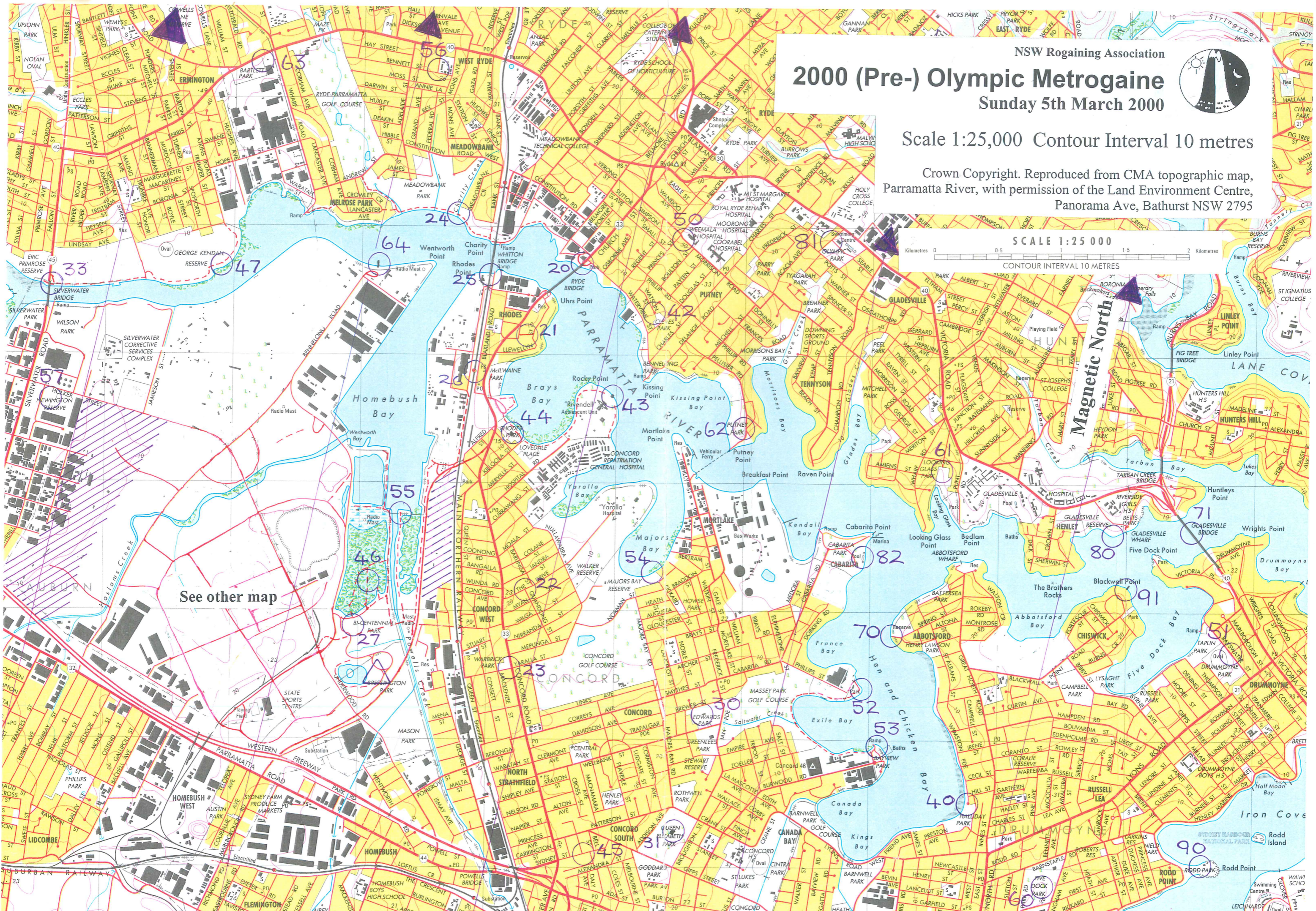


2000 (Pre-) Olympic Metrogaine

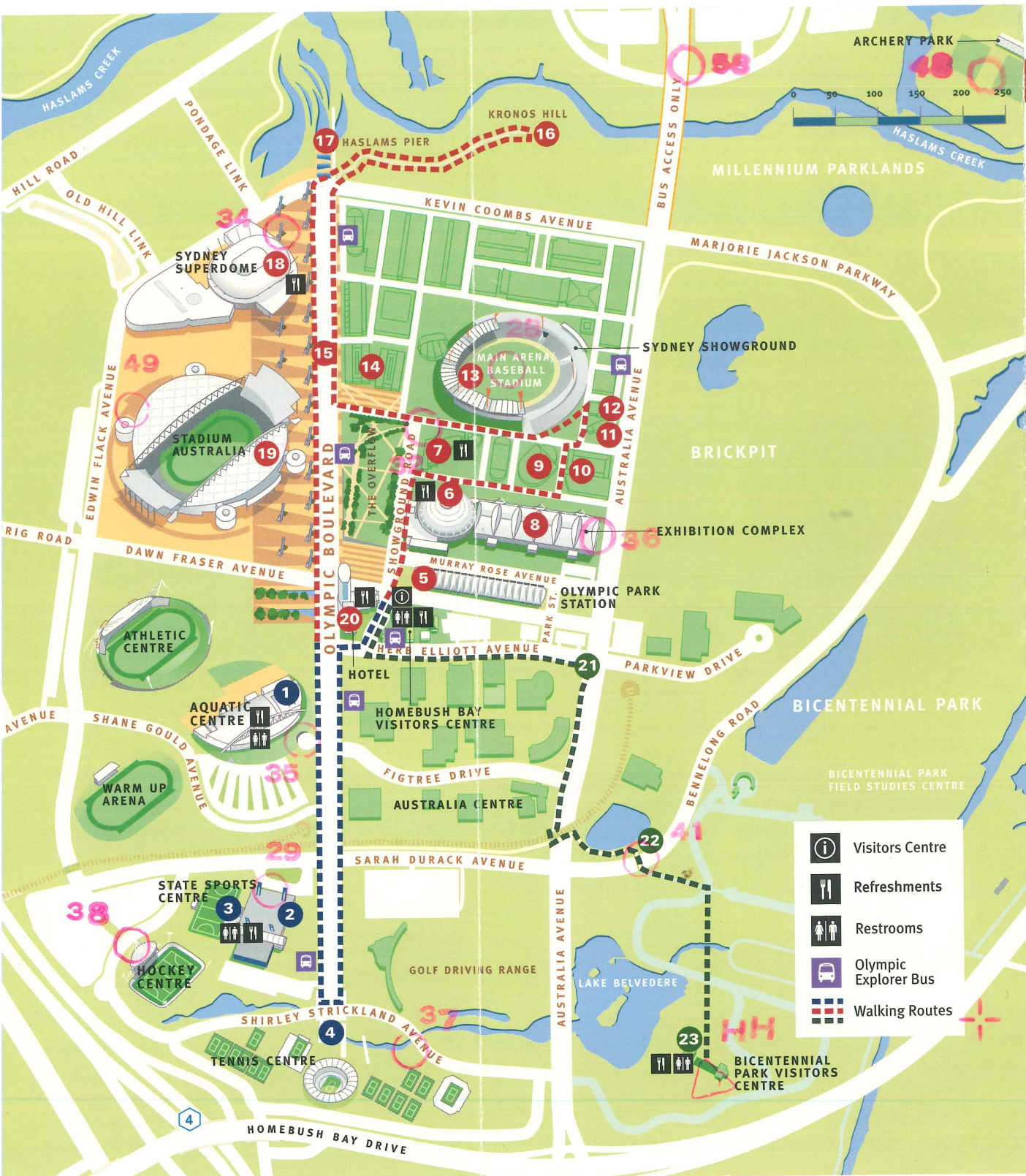
Scale 1:25,000 Contour Interval 10 metres

2 Sydney Showground/Kronos Hill Walk

1hr 15min

- ① Homebush Bay Visitors Centre.
- ⑤ The award winning Olympic Park Station is designed to move up to 50,000 people an hour during major events.
- ⑥ The Sydney Showground, home of the Royal Easter Show, will provide venues for Olympic and Paralympic sports, as well as athlete training, media and spectator facilities.
- ⑦ The Southee Complex is the horticulture display area during the Show.
- ⑧ The Dome and Exhibition Halls provide year round exhibition space. During the Games they will host handball, badminton, rhythmic gymnastics and volleyball.
- ⑨ During Show time, the Charles Moses Stadium is where Australia's woodchop champions compete.
- ⑩ The Howie Complex provides a first class venue for dog shows during the Show.
- ⑪ Cat shows, with cats of all shapes and sizes, are housed in the unique Wynne Pavilion.
- ⑫ The Clydesdale Pavilion, constructed with recycled timber, is the permanent home for these large, beautiful horses.

- ⑬ The Main Arena where the Show's Grand Parades are held will be the Olympic Baseball Centre in 2000.
- ⑭ Sydney Indoor Sports Centre, houses sheep and poultry during the Show.
- ⑮ The 1.5 kilometre Olympic Boulevard links major sporting venues, the Athlete Village and other facilities.
- ⑯ Kronos Hill is one the highest points at Homebush Bay. The pathway is quite steep in parts.
- ⑰ The Northern Water Feature includes a spectacular fountain and wetland pool.
- ⑱ The Sydney SuperDome is Australia's biggest indoor sports and entertainment centre. During the Olympic Games it will host artistic gymnastics and basketball.
- ⑲ Stadium Australia will seat 110,000 people during the Opening and Closing Ceremonies of both the Olympic and Paralympic Games.
- ⑳ The Novotel/Hotel Ibis comprises the 19 level, 168 room Novotel and the nine level, 150 room Hotel Ibis.

3 Bicentennial Park Walk

20mins

- ① The Homebush Bay Visitors Centre.
- ② Stroll down Herb Elliott Avenue and turn right onto Australia Avenue. Just before the Sarah Durack Avenue intersection, take the stairs up to the right which will lead to the footbridge across Australia Avenue.

- ② Footbridge to Bicentennial Park.
- ③ Bicentennial Park is one of the most beautiful parks in Sydney. Enjoy a picnic or a snack at the cafe or take a stroll on the boardwalk through the wetlands. Bicentennial Park Visitors Centre open 9.30am - 4.30pm. Entry is free.
